The centre is building upon the success of the ARC Centre of Excellence for Climate System Science, which concluded in June 2018.

Networking Circles

Networking circles were developed to facilitate interaction and discussion among workshop attendees that may not have occurred otherwise. They also enable younger researchers to benefit from the experience and advice of more senior colleagues. Your group number is on your lanyard and you will be seated with your group at the workshop dinner on Monday night. Do use this time to get to know the members of your group. You will note that your group consists of people from a range of institutions, research programs, and levels of research "age".

It is our hope that the relationships you form with those in your group during our networking/ice breaking adventures continue throughout the workshop, and beyond. Therefore, we have included a couple additional tasks for you to complete throughout the next few days...

- 1. **All** visit the posters of the members of your networking circle.
- 2. **Mid-late career researchers** introduce the early career researchers in your circle to at least one person you think they should know.
- 3. **Early career researchers** ask mid-late career researchers in your circle about the greatest challenge faced in their career thus far, and how they overcame it.

Posters and poster sessions

All workshop attendees are encouraged to bring a poster and those who are bringing a poster are invited to attend the poster feedback sessions.

All attendees bringing a poster will be asked prior to the workshop to register their poster through the website; upon registration your poster will be assigned a number. When you arrive in Wollongong, please find your way to the Grand Ballroom/Throsby Room on the mezzanine floor where you will be asked to hang your poster on the poster board with the corresponding number.

Poster can be hung Sunday afternoon (4-6pm) or Monday morning (8-8:30am).

It is your responsibility to keep your own poster tube. Tubes left in the poster room are <u>unlikely</u> to find their way back to their original owner and will not be stored for you.

Travelling from interstate

Sydney Domestic Airport to Wollongong

Train from Sydney domestic airport

- 1. Go to the airport station's platform 2.
- 2. Catch the train to Wolli Creek Station and change to platform 4 for your train to Wollongong (The South Coast line)


Wifi
